<u>Homework</u>

Homework in Year 1 concentrates on Reading, Phonics and Maths.

- Daily reading at home
- A short Phonics activity focussing on any gaps or the phase we're working on
- A Maths activity to consolidate learning from the week

These tasks will be set on a **Thursday** and due in the following week. You will receive these next week.

<u>Reading</u>

Children in Year 1 will take home 2 reading books. One book is their levelled reading book, this will be changed on a **Monday** and **Thursday**. The other book will be chosen by your child from our class library. This will be one to enjoy together at home, for the adult to read to their child. It will be changed on a **Monday**.

Please ensure their books and reading records are in school daily, as we like to hear the children read aloud at different times throughout the week.

<u>Phonics</u>

We are starting Phase 5a in phonics which is alternative spellings for sounds, for example ay in hay and ai in paid. On a Thursday I will let you know which graphemes and phonemes we have covered in the week so you can go over these with your child.

<u>PE</u>

PE is delivered on a **Thursday** and a **Friday**. Please ensure that your child's full <u>named</u> PE kit is in school at all times.

<u>Nativity</u>

The nativity rehearsals will be starting soon. The performance date is 12th December 2.15pm and 5.30pm. Information about tickets will be communicated shortly.

History: Guy Fawkes

The children will learn about: Why did Guy Fawkes want to blow up the Houses of Parliament? Who was Guy Fawkes? How do we celebrate Guy Fawkes Day?
