Cherry Class – Autumn Term 2 - November/December 2023

Welcome back to the second half of the autumn term. This is always busy and exciting with the build up to ... dare I say it... Christmas! This letter includes information about the class routines and the curriculum areas your children will be covering in our second term. I hope you find it useful.

<u>Nativity:</u> This year our nativity production will be "A King is Born". A list of parts and costumes will be coming home shortly, as well as details about how to get your tickets for the performances. We are really excited about this and can't wait to start practising.

<u>PE kits:</u> Please ensure that your child has a named PE kit in school **every day** as we often have one off sporting opportunities or need to swap PE times with other classes as and when required. Please could I ask that the PE bag has a visible name on the outside to make it easier to find whose belongs to whom or to find a home for stray PE kit items?

Reading:

Your child will bring home 2 books. One is for your child to read to you. It has been carefully chosen so that they can work out all the words. The other book is for reading for pleasure. It will have words your child may not be able to read yet. It is for you to read to your child and talk about together. Please try to read at least 4x a week with your child, as I explained to many of you at parents' consultations, the demands of the KS1 curriculum are considerable and regular reading practice is essential if your child is to meet or exceed the age-related expectations. We have "Book Club" on Thursday where the children share what they thought of their reading for pleasure book with their group and write a little review or comment about it on a post it note to encourage others to read it. Please make sure your child returns this book on a Thursday. Please also try to complete the reading record when your child reads, as it helps us build a picture of your child as a reader. Please could your child bring the reading record folder into school daily and place it in the basket on their tables. This is extremely helpful for making sure letters get home safely, allows us to read with the children when possible and means we can easily check for any letters from home, lunch menus, etc. It also helps your child develop independence. We change books on Mondays and Thursdays and this is when we check any comments in the reading records. Please make sure if you have any other messages that these are sent via Class Dojo which I check daily, but cannot guarantee I can check during the day. If a message is urgent, please contact the office and they will pass it on. Thank you for your cooperation.

<u>Book bags and belongings:</u> Children should only bring into school a book bag, named PE kit that remains in school, a named drinks bottle, a named coat and a lunch box if they are not having a school lunch. We do ask that no toys, no extra attachments to book bags or extra items are brought in to school. As the weather becomes more inclement, please remember to send a waterproof coat, we will go outside for breaks unless the weather is extremely wet.

Weekly tasks: Each week on a Friday a maths and a phonics/spelling related task will be posted to Class Dojo to support and consolidate work we have been doing in class. About 10 minutes on each.
