## Cherry Class – Summer 1 Term 1 2024

Welcome back after the Easter Holidays, I hope you managed to have a good time despite the disappointing weather. This letter includes information about the class routines and the curriculum areas your children will be covering this half-term.

**Reading**: Reading the school reading books regularly at home (at least 4x a week) remains crucial to developing your child's confidence and fluency in reading. Being a competent reader gives them access to other curriculum areas and is a key indicator of success later in life. We all lead busy lives and I know there is a lot to be slotted into an evening after school but please, can I ask you to regularly read with your child. If time is at a premium, please prioritise reading over other homework. Please do record in the Yellow Reading Records so we are aware of how much they read at home and so we can celebrate this too. Please also make sure reading folders come into school every day.

<u>PE kits:</u> Please ensure that your child has a named PE kit in school **every day** as we often have one off sporting opportunities or need to swap PE times with other classes as and when required. We are asking parent's to please check they have the correct PE kit for their child, dark blue or black shorts, a plain white t-shirt, and trainers. Children need to remove watches and earrings for PE so please consider keeping these at home on PE days (Tuesday and Wednesday). Please could I ask that the PE bag has a visible name on the outside to make it easier to find whose belongs to whom or to find a home for stray PE kit items?

<u>Book bags and belongings:</u> Children should only bring into school a book bag, named PE kit that remains in school, a named drinks bottle, a named coat and a lunch box if they are not having a school lunch. We do ask that no toys, no extra attachments to book bags or extra items are brought in to school. As the weather becomes warmer you may wish to send in named hats and sunscreen.

**Weekly tasks:** Each week on a Friday a maths and a phonics/spelling related task will be posted to Class Dojo and any associated sheets in the homework books to support and consolidate work we have been doing in class. About 10 minutes on each.
