Around the Classes Mr Gillan

At the end of the 4th week, classes have their own rhythms and patterns, from phonics in Chestnut and Rowan as soon as they come in, to arithmetic question and answers for our oldest pupils in Oak. I've had the pleasure of observing our youngest

pupils in action in phonics, as well as leading maths with Year 6. An element that all rooms share is learning walls: a space in a room where teachers display their latest learning on large pieces of paper. This instant-display is meant to help pupils remember key thoughts and objectives from the session, so that they can look at it the next day and have a useful reminder. This



photo, taken in Cherry Class, shows a good example of the process: teacher-modelling / instant feedback from pupils / paper is ripped off and put on the wall as immediate reminder of the key learning. The paper then changes as soon as a new topic is visited.
