2nd Half Term Mr Gillan

- **Welcome back to** Half term 2, historically a very exciting time in schools! There is an abundance of important and exciting experiences to be had during November and December, so we will endeavour to update you as much as possible as we move ahead.
- Remembrance Day will be observed in school, next week. Classes will be
 - involved in learning around the subject and we will hold a small worship and service at the appropriate time during the day. Running up to the day, we will be selling various items that we've managed to source. It has been quite hard to find a selection this year, so there will be a limited stock available to each class. We ask that pupils, should they want to purchase an item, put the suggested item and amount into an envelope and bring it into school. We can

Corganisers: As you will be aware, our Learning Experience letters (pictured here) have been a key feature of class communication for the last 2 years. This letter sets out the key learning features that your child will focus on for a set amount time (normally 2 to 3 weeks). As a school, we have been reviewing our curriculum and focusing on the Intent, Implementation and Impact of the learning in which our pupils take part. In light of this work, our pupils will now also be given a sheet known as a knowledge organiser. This will give them a clear picture of key facts that will be learned, specific vocabulary connected to that



topic and also any important dates and timelines. This knowledge-based approach will, we feel, equip our pupils with the necessary facts for success in that area of the curriculum over time.
