

School Notices Mr Gillan



It was a challenging week in school and I thank all families for their patience, understanding and cooperation during such times. Due to COVID cases in our Chestnut Class bubble, this group will be learning from home for this week. Every school wants to keep pupils in school to be educated, but we follow the guidance given to us until advised to change our protocols. It is fair to say that schools are in a tricky position as the end of term draws near. Cases are rising rapidly in the region (according to data sent to all Heads), but the national headlines state 'freedom day is close'. I feel it is right that I stay cautious with the health and wellbeing of the pupils in my care, as well as my staff and you, my families. This last week has proven that now is not the time to abandon all the hard work we have done together, but to get you all to the summer break as safely as we can.

- Year 6 are nearing the end of their time at Thurlbear. As always, Mrs Yellowley is intent on making it a happy, memorable time for them all. For families attending, we will give out the safety details for the last day of term as soon as we have the latest guidance and have planned for social distancing etc. I will send this directly to Year 6 families.

- We have a vacancy for a Parent Governor to join the governing body at Thurlbear. Governors play a key role in the school. The Parent Governor is elected to give a parental perspective in discussions and decisions. The

Governing Body is made up of parents, teachers and other members of the community. Every term the Governing Body meets to support the work of the



school, and together with the Head teacher, is responsible for making sure that the school provides a good standard of education for pupils and helps ensure the school meet its aims. You may also sit on other

sub-committees linked to the skills you bring to the board.

There are 3 main functions of a governor:

- 1. Making sure there is clarity in the vision, ethos and the strategic direction of the school
- 2. Holding the Head teacher to account for the educational performance of the school and the performance management of the staff; and
- 3. Making sure that the school spends its money effectively.

Where there is more than one applicant, an election will be held and each candidate will be asked to submit a short statement (no more than 100 words) setting out why they would like to be a Governor and what skills they can bring to the Board. These statements will be provided to all parents, who will then be asked to vote for their preferred candidate.
