The last week of November and lots to report back to families:

- Mrs Sweeney: Sadly, our SENDCo Mrs Sweeney will be leaving us at the end of this term. Happily for her, she has taken a senior, strategic role at the Local Authority. In her time at school, many families have worked with Mrs Sweeney and they will share in my wish that she has a brilliant next-step in her career. We are working hard to find the very best replacement that we can for our school and I will have news on this, soon. Mrs Sweeney will be liaising with families working with her, currently, and discuss any transition needs.
- 4th January: In lieu of the Queen's Jubilee celebrations, we were given a choice by the Local Authority of an extra day holiday in October, January or late July. As 2 of the 3 options were already our INSET days, we have apportioned 4th JANUARY as our extra day. So families will return to school on Wednesday 5th January. Hopefully, with the current news of COVID in our area the highest rates in the whole country and the national guidance being very vague for post-Christmas, even an extra day as a 'fire-break' may work as every-little-helps steps to our start to 2022.
- Our Parent Governors have been decided and all three candidates had fantastic support. It is testament to them all that they were so well supported. A message from Helen Hill, Clerk to the Governors: "The Board at Thurlbear are delighted to say that following an extremely close ballot, we would like to welcome Mrs Ariana Linthorne as our new Parent Governor. Mrs Sarah Hetherington Prissell will also be joining the Board of Governors from January 2022, as second placed, when a new position becomes vacant."
- COVID OFFICER Update: We have had a very interesting regional meeting with our South West COVID Officer, who has given us guidance in the run up to Christmas. As always, this is a fast-moving scenario and this is what we have been told can happen right now. Firstly, larger events can be held if a school does not have significant outbreaks. Even though we are still under Amber Status, we feel we can deliver some of our special events safely with Covid protocols in place. Therefore, our trip to decorate the tree at St Mary Magdelene Church will go ahead with safety measures as will our Nativity play in school 'live', as will our Key Stage 2 Carols 'live'.
