The Government have updated their guidance on attendance of pupils at school. This includes statutory details on attendance codes, punctuality and expectations for families:

At Thurlbear CoE VA Primary School, the health, safety and wellbeing of every child is our top priority. We expect all staff, governors, parent/carers and volunteers to share this commitment to safeguarding our pupils.

- It states: "Only exceptional circumstances warrant an authorised leave of absence. Schools should consider each application individually taking into account the specific facts and circumstances and relevant background context behind the request." We try and work with **all** families to ascertain the reasons behind a pupil's absence and approach every discussion positively and on its own merits.
- "Schools should encourage parents to make appointments out of school hours. Where this is not possible, the pupil should only be out of school for the minimum amount of time necessary for the appointment." We ask every family to consider when appointments are planned for, but we also understand that some appointments are unavoidable in the current national circumstances. We ask every family to provide us with the appointment evidence should you be picking up early. This can come in the form of confirmation of an appointment. Without this, it will be classed as unauthorised.
- **Currently**, we are 96.6% for attendance, this year, which is well above national average, but we try and keep our engagement as high as we can. Our pupils enjoy coming to school and we should be encouraging that with everything we do and say throughout the week!
