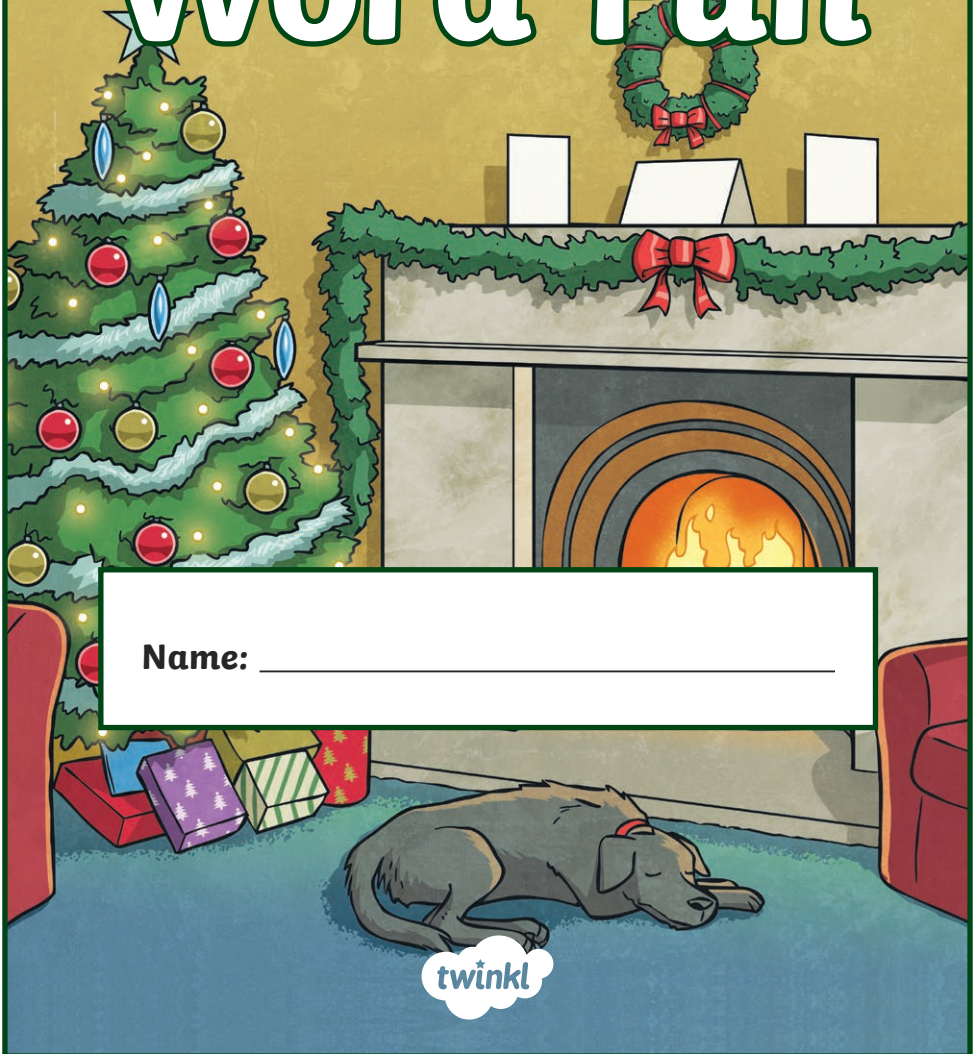

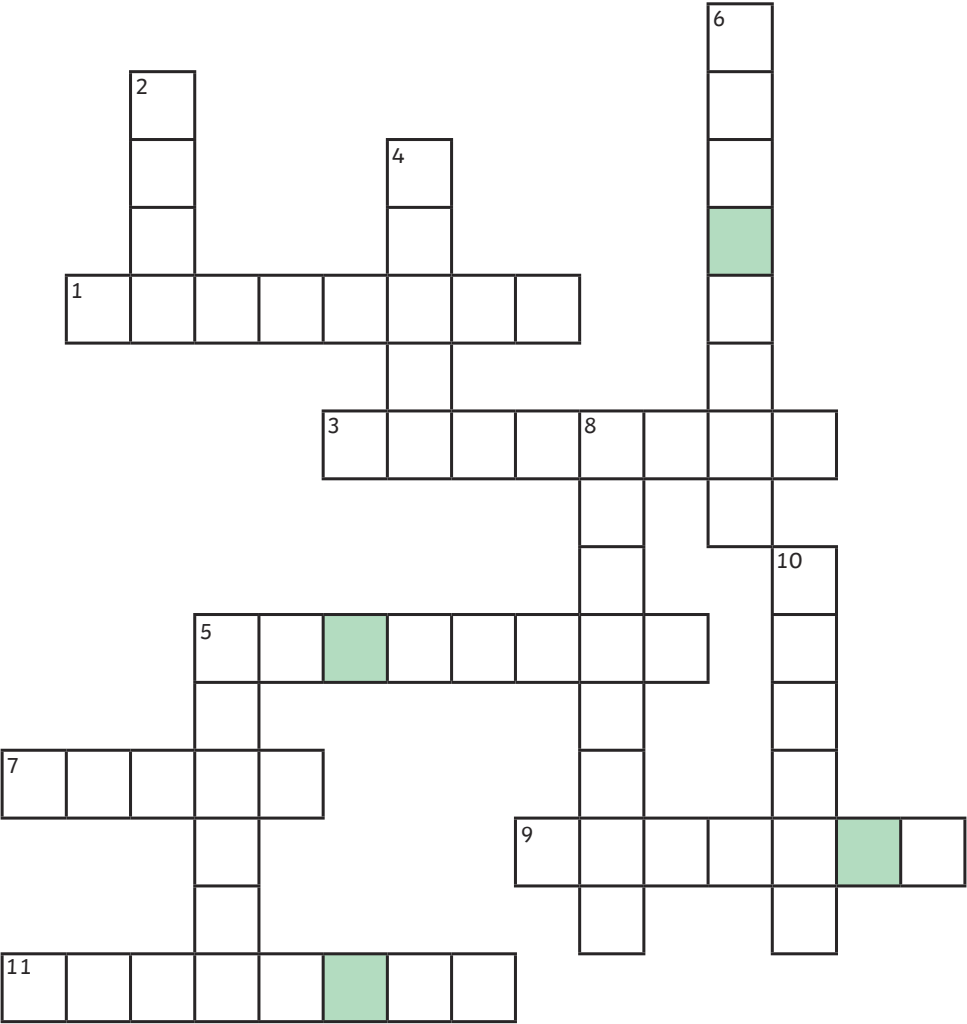

Solve the festive clues below and spell the words correctly to reveal the hidden word.

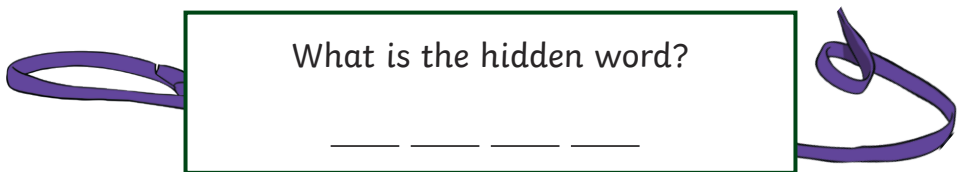

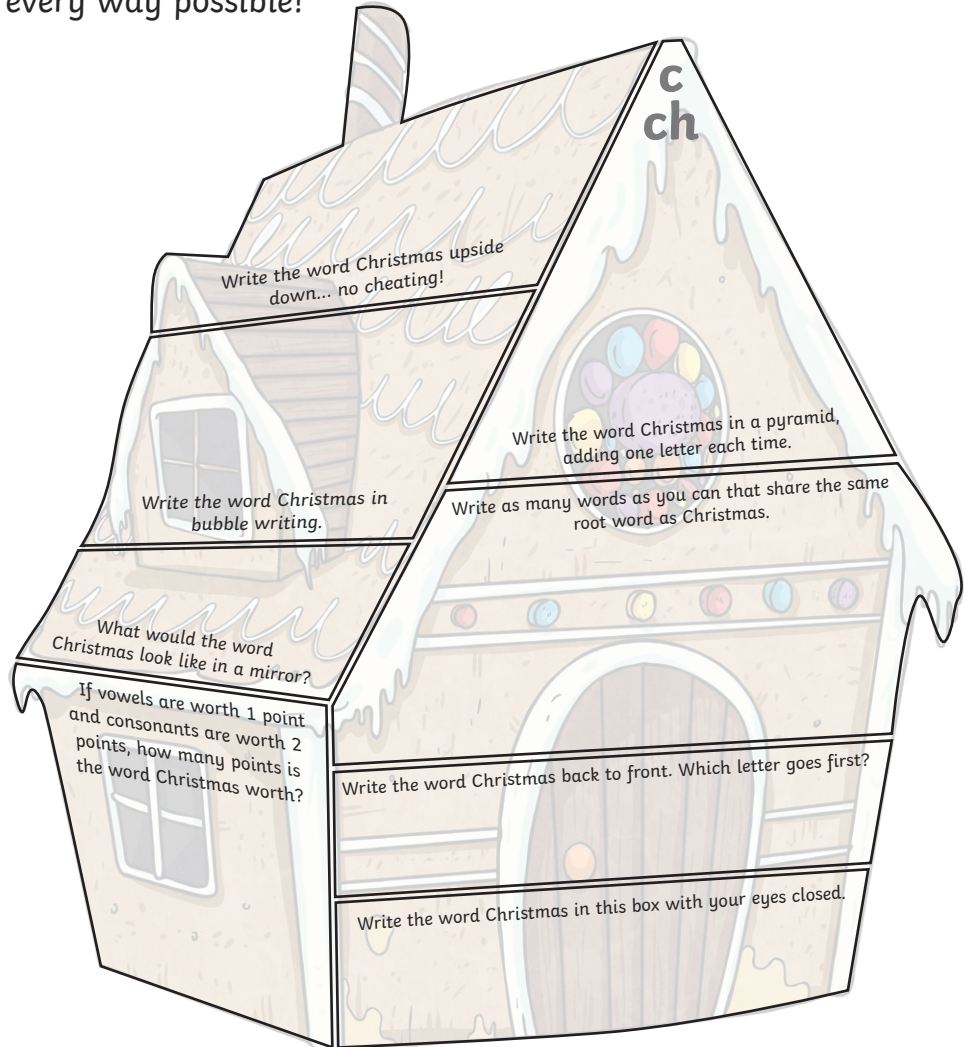
