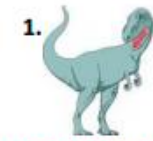


# Dinosaurs

## Vocabulary

<b>dinosaur</b>	An extinct animal that means 'terrible lizard.'
<b>diet</b>	The food and drink that an animal eats.
<b>herbivore</b>	An animal that only eats plants.
<b>carnivore</b>	An animal that only eats meat.
<b>predator</b>	An animal that lives by mostly killing and eating other animals.
<b>prey</b>	An animal that is hunted or killed by other animals for food.
<b>fossil</b>	The remains of plants or animals that lived long ago.
<b>palaeontology</b>	A person who study's fossils.
<b>extinct</b>	When a species of animals or plants die out or disappear completely
<b>reptile</b>	A cold blooded animal with scaly skin, which normally gives birth to young by laying eggs.
<b>mammal</b>	A warm blooded animal, normally with hair or fur, which usually carry their babies and feed them through milk.

## Important discoveries

In 1811, Mary found the fossilised skeleton of a dinosaur named an *Ichthyosaurus* and in 1823 she found a fossilised *Plesiosaurus* skeleton. Many of Mary's fossils are now on display in the Natural History Museum in London.
